

Immunization and Preventive Care Schedule



Age	Procedure
4 – 5 Days	Physical Exam
2 Weeks	Physical Exam Hep B (If not given at birth)
2 Months	Physical Exam DTaP, Hib, IPV, PCV, Rotavirus
4 Months	Physical Exam DTaP, Hib, IPV, PCV, Rotavirus
6 Months	Physical Exam DTaP, Hib, PCV, Rotavirus, Hep B
9 Months	Physical Exam IPV, Hep B
12 Months	Physical Exam Lead, Hematocrit MMR, Varivax, Hep A
15 Months	Physical Exam DTaP, Hib, PCV
18 Months	Physical Exam Hep A
2 Years	Physical Exam Lead, Hematocrit May need catch-up dose of Hep A
3 Years	Physical Exam Lead, Hematocrit
4 – 5 Years	Physical Exam Lead, Hematocrit, Urine DTaP, IPV, MMR, Varivax
6 – 10 Years	Physical Exam May need catch-up dose of Hep A & Varivax
11 – 15 Years	Physical Exam Hematocrit, Urine Tdap, Meningococcal, HPV May need catch-up doses of Hep A & Varivax
16 – 18 Years	Physical Exam Hematocrit for females Meningococcal May need catch-up doses of Hep A & HPV

Immunization Key

DTaP = Diphtheria, Tetanus and acellular Pertussis Vaccine

Hematocrit = a test for anemia

Hep A = Hepatitis A Vaccine

Hep B = Hepatitis B Vaccine

Hib = Haemophilus influenzae Type b Vaccine, an anti-meningitis vaccine

HPV = Human Papillomavirus Vaccine, a vaccine to prevent genital warts and cervical cancer

IPV = Inactivated Polio Vaccine

Lead = a test for lead poisoning

Meningococcal = Meningococcal Vaccine, an anti-meningitis vaccine

MMR = Measles, Mumps, Rubella Vaccine

PCV = Pneumococcal Vaccine, an anti-pneumonia and anti-meningitis vaccine

Rotavirus = Rotavirus Vaccine, to prevent rotavirus stomach flu

Tdap = Tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussis Vaccine

Urine = a urine test

Varivax = Chickenpox Vaccine
